Our dromedary camel rides are hand led by our experienced staff. We charge a small per ride fee to fair patrons and give a \$1 per rider commission to the event. Photos and camel feed may also be available for a small fee. Our camels were hand raised by our family in our traveling zoo. They LOVE people and make an exciting and educational attraction. **This is a great opportunity to provide a unique experience for children and adults alike, while generating income for your event.**

We pride ourselves in keeping our animals happy and healthy, and our exhibits safe and clean. We are licensed by the USDA and the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, as well as the Pennsylvania Game Commission. We provide hand sanitizer in the zoo and display signs educating people about the importance of washing their hands after handling the animals.



- No direct charge to the fair.
- A small fee will be charged to each rider.
- \$1 per paying rider will be given to the event.

What We Provide:

Petting Zoo

- An educational and enjoyable attraction for all ages open for up to 8 hours each day (additional hours are negotiable).
- Our own tents, panels, signs perimeter flags, animals, feed, etc. (a free standing zoo).
- The necessary USDA and state licensing and insurance for a hands on animal display.
- Knowledgeable and friendly staff members to keep the zoo clean and safe and to show visitors the animals and answer their questions.

Camel Ride

- An exciting and unique animal attraction that **earns you money**.
- The perimeter barrier, ride stand, signs, animas, etc. (a free standing animal attraction/ride).
- All necessary federal and state licensing and insurance.
- Knowledgeable and friendly staff members to make sure that every rider has a safe, enjoyable and educational experience.

What We Require:

- A level space on grass approximately equal to 50' x 60' for the zoo and 50' x 60' for the camel ride (size and shape of area may be flexible but must be agreed upon in advance if different from above).
- Access to water within 100' of the zoo/ride.
- One 30 amp RV power hook-up and one 20 amp power hook up within 100' of the zoo/ride.
- Restroom and shower facilities on the event grounds that can be accessed at any time during the fair dates.
- Hand washing/sanitizing facilities in close proximity to the zoo in accordance with any state or local ordinances.
- Straw and hay (usually ~15 - 20 bales of each depending on the length of the event).
- A place to dump manure and soiled bedding in close proximity to the zoo and ride area.

Nice stable endeavor

Petting zoo offers fair-goers a look at the wild side of life

BERRYVILLE — Not every petting zoo has a Rose Hair Taran-tula.

Or a pair of camels.

But that's what Clarke County's Bar C Ranch is offering at the county fair this week.

Wil and Jennifer Caton have a lot of experience entertaining and educating with their unusual animal friends.

They moved their operation from Loudoun County to Clarke nine years ago for another reason — schools.

"We were getting ready to start our family," Wil Caton said. And because their focus is education with animals, they wanted to be in a county where the schools had a reputation for education of young people.

Animals are great educators.

A tarantula or a scorpion or even a big turtle is "irresistible, if you're an 8-year-old boy," Caton said with a smile.

And that doesn't even count the allure of a hissing cockroach.

On Monday, two young men in that age group arrived to point out the hairy spider and a scorpion in another glass cage.

From another case, Caton unearthed a handful of hedgehog for everyone to pet. "We have over 40 different species."

The Bar C Ranch offers a variety of programs, he said, suited for different venues. He can do birthday parties, at-school field trips, even library events.

"There are all kinds of fun books about animals," Caton said, and he can match the animal to the book.

He enjoys imparting information about the animal's habitat, diet and behavior.

Bar C Ranch even helps to enliven "living nativity" scenes with donkeys, sheep, goats and, yes, even camels.

Camels are a sort of specialty at the Bar C.

In the mid-1990s, Caton was training an Australian cattle dog in Great Falls when someone saw his work and offered him the chance to work with a young camel.

"He was just a baby," Caton said. He taught the young dromedary to follow him around, wear a funny hat, and walk backward.

Later, he and his wife Jennifer, who spent her high school years working with the Reston Animal Park, went to Tennessee, where they

worked with all the Knoxville Zoo.

"We would down," he said, give rides to top.

"They do hation," Caton said two animals — and a 2-year-old — have been raised by the Catons since they were just a few days old.

"We raised them on a bottle," he noted, feeding them every four hours at first.

Camels can live to be 30 years old, Caton said, but they are slow growers, so only the oldest of his pair is ready to be trained for riding, which he's doing now.

Maybe next year, he added, he will be able to offer camel rides at the Clarke County Fair.

The trick is getting the camel's trust, he said. "He knows I wouldn't put him in harm's way."

Camels, Caton also noted, are "so intelligent. They have great memory retention," so once they learn a trick, they remember it forever.

Another training technique is a treat. His camels get animal crackers after a training session.

An additional treat: cold

... on a farm, but raised her family in Sterling Park.

"I don't know where he got that," she said of his love of animals.

Caton's children Brody, 6, and Morgan, 8, are already working with the various critters at the Bar C Ranch.

While young Brody, "copies everything he sees his daddy do," Morrison said, her son makes it interesting for them by teaching them so much about all the animals.

That's part of the petting zoo experience, Caton said.

From emus to donkeys to hissing cockroaches, visitors may not be able to talk to them, but they'll know a lot more about them.
